Frequently Asked Questions



Pricing:

Are there different prices for Residents and Non-Residents? What is considered a Resident?

- Yes, there are different prices. Residency is based on where you pay taxes, so you may have an Evansville address or be in the Evansville School District but are paying taxes to Union or other local Townships. Daily admission is \$5 for Residents, \$10 for Non-Residents. More than three numbers in an Evansville address, indicates you are a Non-Resident.

How much are Family Passes?

- Family passes start at \$180 for Residents and \$275 for Non-Residents. The base rate for those is for a family of 4, you can add household members to your Family Pass for \$10/person for Residents and \$15/person for Non-Residents.

Can you include both Residents and Non-Residents on a pass?

- **YES!** You can on a Punch Pass! Family Passes, each family can add ONE babysitter/caretaker. That individual will be included in the same “residency” as the household.

How much is Lap Swim?

- Lap Swim is \$3 a person for Residents and \$4 a person for Non-Residents.

Do you have a Group Rate?

- **YES!** The Group Rate applies to groups of over ten people and lowers the price for each individual. For Resident groups it is \$3 per person and for Non-Resident groups it is \$4 per person.

Are there discounts for Seniors?

- On season passes, yes, but for daily rates no.

Can I leave and come back without paying again?

- **YES!** You can leave and come back the **SAME DAY** that you paid.

Do you take cash/card/check?

- Yes, we take all three. However, there is a 3% service fee on credit cards.



Hours:

What are your hours?

- Weekdays: 12 - 8, breaks are from 2 - 2:15, 4 - 4:30 (Only slides are closed), and 6 - 6:15
 - Weekends: 12 - 6, our break is from 3 - 3:20
 - From June 17th to June 28th and July 15th to July 26th we will be closed from 4:30 to 6:30 everyday due to Swim Lessons and Swim Team that occur at the same time.

When is Lap Swim?

- Lap Swim is 6 - 7:30 am every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday
- 8 - 9 am every Tuesday and Thursday
- If you are not able to come in the morning, during Open Swim in the afternoon there will be one lap lane available for use.

Is there a Night Swim?

- Unfortunately, we do not offer a specific Night Swim, although we are open until 8:00 pm.



Items:

Can I bring in my cooler?

- Unfortunately, you cannot, we do not allow coolers. You can leave the facility and eat outside with a cooler if you would like.

Can I bring a small lunchbox?

- Small lunchboxes are fine, as long as there is no alcohol or glass.

Can my kid bring a lifejacket or a floatie?

- Kids are allowed to wear lifejackets as long as they are U.S. Coast Guard approved; however, they are not a substitute for supervision.
- Water Wings, Arm Floaties, and Mermaid Tails are not allowed. Although you can bring a tube floatie for the lazy river, if it is not bigger than the tubes we provide.

What items are not allowed?

- We do not allow coolers, glass, any type of alcohol, tobacco/vapes, or animals.

Do you sell or have Swim Diapers/Sunscreen/Goggles/Towels?

- No, we do not.

Do you provide lockers/How do I get a locker?

- Yes, we do! However, we do not provide locks. All the lockers are first come, first serve when you are at the pool, if you want your items to be secure though you will need to bring your own lock. All items must be removed from the lockers and taken with you each day.



The Swim Test:

My kid passed the swim test somewhere else/is a qualified swimmer/can swim; do they still need to pass it here?

- Yes, they do. All kids 13 and under must pass the Swim Test.

Can my kid swim without passing The Swim Test?

- Yes, they can! They can even do the slides, as long as they are above 48 inches tall. If your child has not passed the Swim Test, they may not go into the Lap Pool without a responsible person who is 15 years of age or older. They may not use the Diving Board or the Climbing Wall.

How old does my kid have to be to pass The Swim Test?

- All kids, ages 13 and under, must take the "Swim Test" to have full use of the facility. Kids ages 7 and under can take the Swim Test, but they cannot enter the facility without a responsible person who is at least 15 years of age.

What times are The Swim Tests?

- Weekdays: 12:20 - 12:40, 2 - 2:20, 4 - 4:20, 6 - 6:20
- Weekends: 12:20 - 12:40, 2 - 2:20, 4 - 4:20
- If your child is interested in taking the "Swim Test" during any one of these times, let a lifeguard know.
