 - Stuart confirmed Chief Reese felt comfortable making his recommendation with the citations reported. Chief Reese reaffirmed his recommendation per guidelines as set forth in the Municipal Code Sec.6-44(c)(4)(a).
 - (2) Stuart made a motion seconded by Duggan, to approve Operator license application for Jeremy James Welter (not recommended). Stuart withdrew her motion, seconded by Duggan.

Mr. Welter attended the meeting virtually. Chairperson Duggan opened the item for discussion; Mr. Welter wanted to address the committee. Stuart clarified the strangulation/battery/disorderly conduct from 8/2019 listed on the application was the situation leading to the felony conviction indicated from the Chief's comments. Mr. Welter confirmed it was the disclosed charge and he remains on probation until February 2022 due to said charge. Chief Reese reiterated his non-recommendation was based on the totality of the charges in accordance with Municipal Code 6-44(c)(5)(a) and 6-44(c)(5)(c) which states: Overall Conviction Record, Felons, or Other Offenses. No operator's license may be issued under this guideline to any person who has: a) Been convicted of a felony that substantially relates to the circumstances of the licensed activity unless the person has been duly pardoned; c) Convictions not specifically listed above may also be grounds for denial of a License, as reasonably determined in the sound discretion of the City;

Duggan asked if alcohol was involved, Mr. Welter claimed there was not. Stuart asked for consideration of the committee to table the motion until the December $1^{\rm st}$ meeting, where Mr. Welter will need to provide a letter from his Probation Officer. Mr. Welter agreed.

- (3) Stuart made a motion seconded by Duggan, to approve Operator license application for Emilia Anna Mattingly (not recommended). *Motion denied 3-0*.
- B. Stuart made a motion seconded by Lewis, to recommend to Common Council Ordinance 2021-11 Stop Sign Amendment. *Motion carries 3-0*
