Bill Lathrop, Evansville Today, 468 W Main Street wanted to bring up the topic of the tenant living in the City’s Municipal Parking Lot. Mr. Lathrop would like the Committee to take an intentional approach to the topic, as currently no Ordinance allows (or not) situations such as this. Chief Reese has offered to research the topic for committee review. Becker agreed a policy or ordinance should be in place.

Shannon Arndt, Ceili Coffee, 16 W Main St, requested committee reconsideration for approval or a temporary license for an Operator’s License Applicant that was denied at the August 3rd meeting, for her employee, Andrea Jean Hance. No action was taken and staff will contact the applicant when a decision is made after hearing from the City Attorney.

John Peterson, resident at 111 W Main St, played an audio recording of church bells that rang in his backyard for over 6 hours. Mr. Peterson states that due to the lack of a Noise Ordinance in the City this lead to Disturbing of the Peace. Chairperson Stuart gave her appreciation for him attending the meeting and explained decimal is hard to calibrate which is why many municipalities do not have such ordinances.

Nancy Peterson, resident at 111 W Main St, wanted to know what discussions have occurred since the bell ringing occurred, and when discussions do occur, she would like to be notified. Mrs. Peterson shared the incident caused her both emotional and physical stress. Alderperson Lewis agreed and shared his opinion that it was disruptive and due to the 6-hour duration, it no longer constitutes as Freedom of Speech. Chief Reese will look into what ordinances other municipalities have and what language the City could use.

Patricia Fleming resident, 800 Brown School Rd, expressed her concerns of ATV/UTVs on the roadway. Her apprehensions include safety concerns with differing regulations between the DNR and DOT in regards to OWI/DUIS and the age demographic of residents on her road. Alderperson Lewis thanked Ms. Fleming for sharing her concerns as validation of his own reservations on the matter.

2. Continued Safety

- a. Continued PPE all patient care or contact per our Medical Control
- b. Continued cleaning and disinfection of ambulances after runs and with inventory

3. Training:

a. Sept. training was in-person covering respiratory emergencies. October training is also in person and on Trauma. Morgan attended training and obtained certification to teach "Stop the Bleed" skills. The 2 EMTs in A-EMT class are doing well and learning a lot. I did an online Leadership Conference with different speakers. Morgan went to a planning meeting with the Fire department to start planning a mock Active Shooter incident coming up. We are currently working with Rob Balsamo at BTC for an EVOC course for all EMS employees. This will be held in town so all can attend, date to be determined yet

4. New Employee: We have had some interest in EMS, ongoing conversations

5. Maintenance/Communication:

a. Still waiting on the radios to be delivered, programmed and installed for 642. With new Cat wire/cord MDT has had no problems with staying connected, will be working with IT guys to install line properly soon.

- b. New Portable radios are in service and on the ambulance

6. Building Needs:

a. Jason has been working on getting the garage doors widened for the ambulance bay for 641, per Jason the door has been ordered. Work Permit has been issued.

b. Generator for garage

7. Recruitment for new hires have continue. Flyers at both MATC and BTC still sharing on their Facebook as well as having posters up within the schools. We will be attending a Speed Recruitment fair at BTC in October. They are planning on about 50 newly graduated students attending.

9. General Updates: EMS and Fire attended the Evansville Heroes day at The Night Owl. Along with PD and Fire, we were given some donations from local businesses in support of our services. I have had a couple meetings with the Director of Nursing and the Assistance Director at the Manor in attempt to understand the increased call volumes. Have also spoken with our Medical Director about the ongoing issues. EMS was awarded funds from the Flex Grant I wrote for in July. I had to send a revised budget to the State for approval. I applied for the Evansville Fund grant with Morgan's assistance, to purchase Manikins for CPR teaching and Arms for teaching "Stop the Bleed" to prepare for traumatic and/or Active Shooter incidents. Continuing to look for more grants available to assist funding for EMS.
